Course Description:

Continuation of Latin 1 and 2. The course goal is to continue the student's comprehensive instruction not only in the Latin language and how it works, but also to enhance understanding of the Roman and post-Roman culture in which Latin flourished as an active literary language. This instruction will be within the framework of God's plan of history and how the Roman world served as God's tool for the spread of the Gospel.

Course Outcomes:

During this course the students will:

- Review the basic concepts delivered in Latin 2;
- Enhance translation skills by studying the works of Caesar, Catullus, Cicero and others;
- Develop an understanding common literary devices;
- Learn to identify Latin syntactical forms and uses;
- Learn the dictionary form, part of speech and meaning of 500 Latin words;
- Learn to appreciate the heritage of Roman culture, civilization and history;
- Learn to utilize English grammar and vocabulary more efficiently and effectively.

Course Materials:

Textbooks: *Latin for the New Millennium: Levels II & III, 1st Edition; both texts will be needed.* (Bolchazy-Carducci, Publishers, Inc.)

Other course materials will be available online through the ALHSO Moodle course management system.

Course Outline:

First Semester Lessons 1 – 11, Latin 2, Chapters 7 - 15

Second Semester Lessons 1 – 14, Latin 3, Chapters 1 - 2 "Authors of the Late Republic; Caesar and Cicero"

Evaluation & Grading Scale:

Assignments: Each graded assignment in the course is assigned a certain number of points. The course percentage grade will be determined by comparing the points earned out of points possible and then converting to a letter grade based on the grading scale below. Points will be deducted for late submission of assignments. A student's current grade in the course will be available as we progress.

A separate "Semester Grade" will be given for each semester.
